Transition -

The transition into secondary school is fast approaching for year 6 pupils and The Warwickshire School Health & Wellbeing Service would like to wish all students well in their move to secondary school.

Below is a list of 12 steps which may help students prepare for their transition:-

Look at the school website and find out useful information on your new school
Practice packing up all the things you will need to take to school, maybe pack the night before.

Practice buying your own food and drink in a café. Find out how the canteen & pay machines at the school work.

Plan the route you will take to your new school and do a few trial runs. Do you need to sort out a bus pass?

Make sure you make time to eat breakfast - it gives you fuel for the day.

Make the most of the Transition Day - don't be afraid to ask questions.

Do you use a planner/diary? It may be worth you getting one and practice using it.

If you have a map of your new school, have a look and get used to using it.

Find out about the uniform and order in plenty of time. Be aware of school policies on things like jewellery, piercings and mobile phones.

Talk to friends and siblings. Who else do you know who is moving to the same school?

Get into a good bedtime routine. Young people still need lots of sleep as your brain is constantly developing.

Start taking responsibility for yourself by practicing getting your school bag ready, doing your homework, and getting yourself up in the morning.

All secondary schools in Warwickshire have confidential advisories which are run by school nurses where pupils have the opportunity to meet face to face to discuss any health related concerns.
