Developing The Arts

As part of our drive to broaden our curriculum, at Wood End we are looking for opportunities to explore and develop our arts provision in school. The Arts is classed as dance, creative writing, art, music and drama. There are many exciting initiatives in school that promote the Arts to all of our children. We are looking to open doors and show children the opportunities that exist in the creative world.

Music - Year 3 have a visiting music teacher each week and have been learning to play different instruments - they are currently learning the recorder. They are learning to read music and perform together. As a school, we have purchased a new music scheme - Charanga! to support teachers in the delivery of exciting music lessons pitched at age-related expectations. All pupils can choose to have individual music lessons provided by Independent Music Solutions - information is available from the office. Many children also choose to take part in Young Voices - the largest school choir in the world!

Dance - We have curriculum lessons delivered every other half term by Embody. I am sure as parents you have seen the quality work that is produced. Badger class have been learning a Bollywood dance with the Hippodrome and will have the opportunity to perform on the main stage of the theatre as a culmination of their hard work. We also have a new dance club after school run by Nouveau Theatre Dance Club.

Art - As a school we look to use art in as many ways as we can to support and enhance the curriculum. Some recent work from our budding artists in Fox class can be seen on our Twitter feed.

Drama - Year 1 have been working with the Hippodrome on dramatic performances based on Dear Zoo. They have been to the theatre and undertaken workshops and visiting teachers are now enhancing this work in school. We also promote drama through our use of the Power of Reading which uses dramatic techniques to bring texts to life with the children and develop their creative writing.

It is through exposing children to these opportunities that we hope to light a spark of imagination and creativity within the children and give our talented children a chance to shine. Who knows we may have the next stars of stage, screen or gallery within our walls at Wood End. Watch this space!

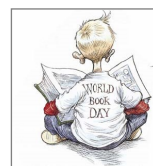
Spot Light on Excellence.....
