



Doctors/Dentist appointments in school time

We prefer parents to avoid booking appointments during the school day because of children missing important work in school. However, we understand that this is sometimes unavoidable. We do however require an appointment card in order to be able to authorise appointments on official school registers.

VERY IMPORTANT

It is <u>essential</u> that the school has up-to-date contact details for parents. Of particular importance is the need for the school to have correct mobile phone numbers for all parents. We use the schools 'text message' service to alert parents of school closure, illness or 'strange danger' issues.

Polite Reminder: Parent Pay

Parents are reminded to regularly log onto Parent Pay and clear any monies owed. Payments for Lunch and Breakfast/Afterschool club must be made in advance. Trips, afterschool activities, music lessons and swimming need to be paid by the dead-line. Failure to make timely payments may result in your child being excluded from these activities.

Financial help may be available for those parents finding it difficult to make the payments. In these circumstances please speak to the School Office who can arrange for you to discuss it with the Headteacher.

Collecting Children from School

Please ensure arrangements for collecting children are made <u>before</u> the start of the school day to avoid confusion and so that children are fully aware of who will be collecting them. Children in Reception must be dropped off and collected by a named adult.
