Relationships and Sex Education (RSE)

There is a lot of publicity surrounding the teaching of RSE in the press at the moment with the issues at Anderton Park in Birmingham. The government have recently overhauled their expectations surrounding this area of the curriculum and as a result from September 2019 RSE and PSHE will be statutory in all schools.

At our schools we have always taught aspects of RSE through our work on Protective Behaviours and PSHE lessons. Upper Key Stage 2 learn about puberty and relationships- covering very basic sex education. The aim of the new legislation is to reflect relationships in the modern world. This will include online relationships and exploitation.

Children will be taught at an age-appropriate level and our staff will be sensitive in their delivery. Key themes will include:

- **different types of relationships**, including friendships, family relationships and dealing with strangers.
- how to recognise, understand and build **healthy relationships**, including self-respect and respect for others, commitment, tolerance, boundaries and consent, and how to manage conflict, and also how to recognise unhealthy relationships;
- how relationships may **affect health and wellbeing, including mental health**;
- healthy relationships and **safety online**.

Over the course of this half term and at the start of next half term, there will be a consultation with parents about our RSE curriculum as the policy is rewritten to reflect the change in statutory guidance. Parents will be given an opportunity to comment on our ideas and put forwards any concerns. There will still be the right for parents to withdraw children from sex education however relationships education will be taught separately from this.

RSE forms part of our safeguarding curriculum - teaching pupils about appropriate relationships and being able to recognise where relationships are not healthy for whatever reason. By using their existing network of trusted adults children should gain the tools to be able to verbalise when a relationship is giving them their Early Warning Signs. This should enable us to make children feel safe.

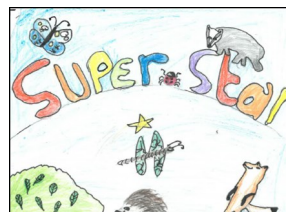
Spot Light on Excellence.....
