#### Uniform - Instilling a sense of pride

We are all immensely proud of belonging to our school. The clearest way that we demonstrate this is through taking pride in our uniform. Uniform is an issue that has been discussed for decades but at our school we feel that uniform creates equality by removing social boundaries and it gives our children a clear identity. Uniform isn't just about the jumper, it is about the overall appearance of the whole school - looking like a collective.

I want to take this opportunity to remind you of our uniform expectations as the Summer term is when uniform often starts to wane. We want to ensure our sense of pride and belonging is maintained right until the end of term.

We ask that children wear a jumper with the school logo on it. These are available from the office and you can pay for them through ParentPay. It is the only item we insist on having a logo. The rest of our uniform can be purchased from supermarkets or online retailers. We ask that children wear a plan white polo shirt (with a collar and three buttons), black skirt, trousers or shorts; black or white socks and black school shoes. Black boots, pumps or trainers are not allowed and staff will address pupils in the incorrect footwear. In the summer, summer dresses can be worn in the school's colour. This includes the playsuit option which retailers have recently started stocking.

For PE, we still want the children to look like they belong to our school. That is why we ask that they all wear a plain white t-shirt (not a polo shirt) and black shorts. If PE is inside we do not expect children to wear leggings/ tracksuit bottoms. Pumps or trainers are allowed for outdoor PE. Earrings need to be removed by the children or have plasters over them for safety reasons.

The most important thing is to **label your child's belongings**. It is very hard to locate lost property if there is no name in the item. We have jumpers, cardigans, pumps, etc that have not been claimed but because there is no name we cannot reunite them with the owner. We understand that items get mislaid but names will help both your child and the staff.

I appreciate your continued support with the school uniform policy and it does make me proud when I can see a school full of children who are equally proud of where they belong.


